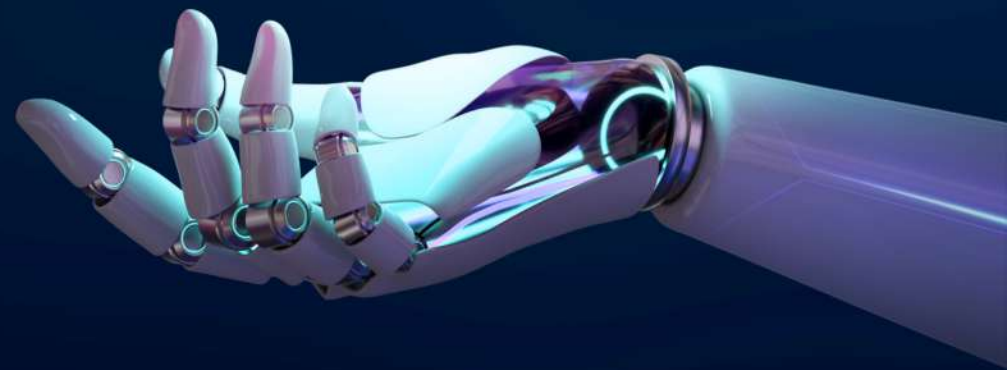


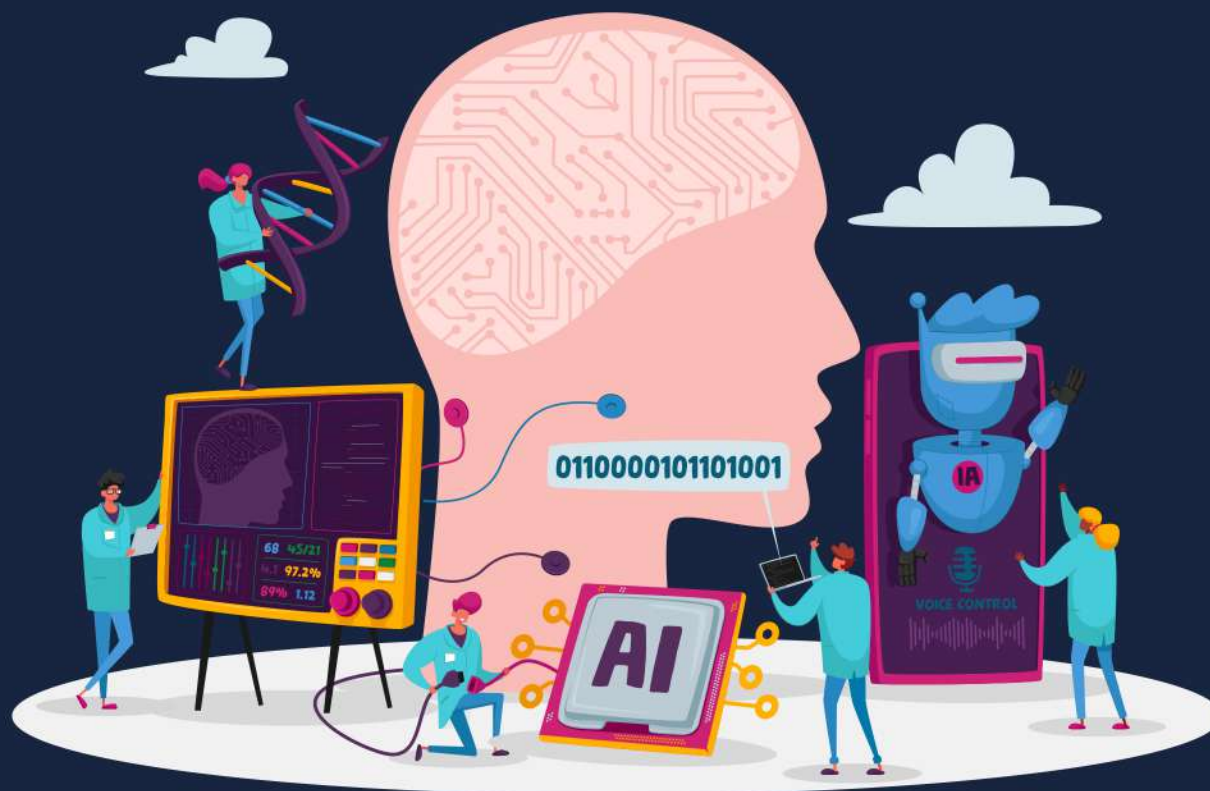
Bill of Law on the use of Artificial Intelligence is proposed in the Brazilian Federal Senate

Bill of Law 2338/2023 was presented to the Senate on May 3rd, 2023



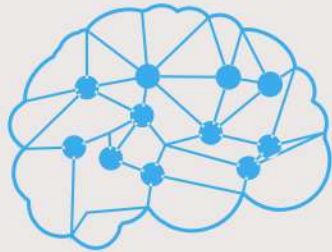

PL 2338/2023 seeks to reconcile "the protection of fundamental rights and freedoms, the valorization of work and of human dignity and the technological innovation represented by artificial intelligence."



For that purpose, the recent impact of the development and popularization of AI technologies on various human activities, as well as the possible and profound economic and social changes that may occur in the near future, were taken into account.

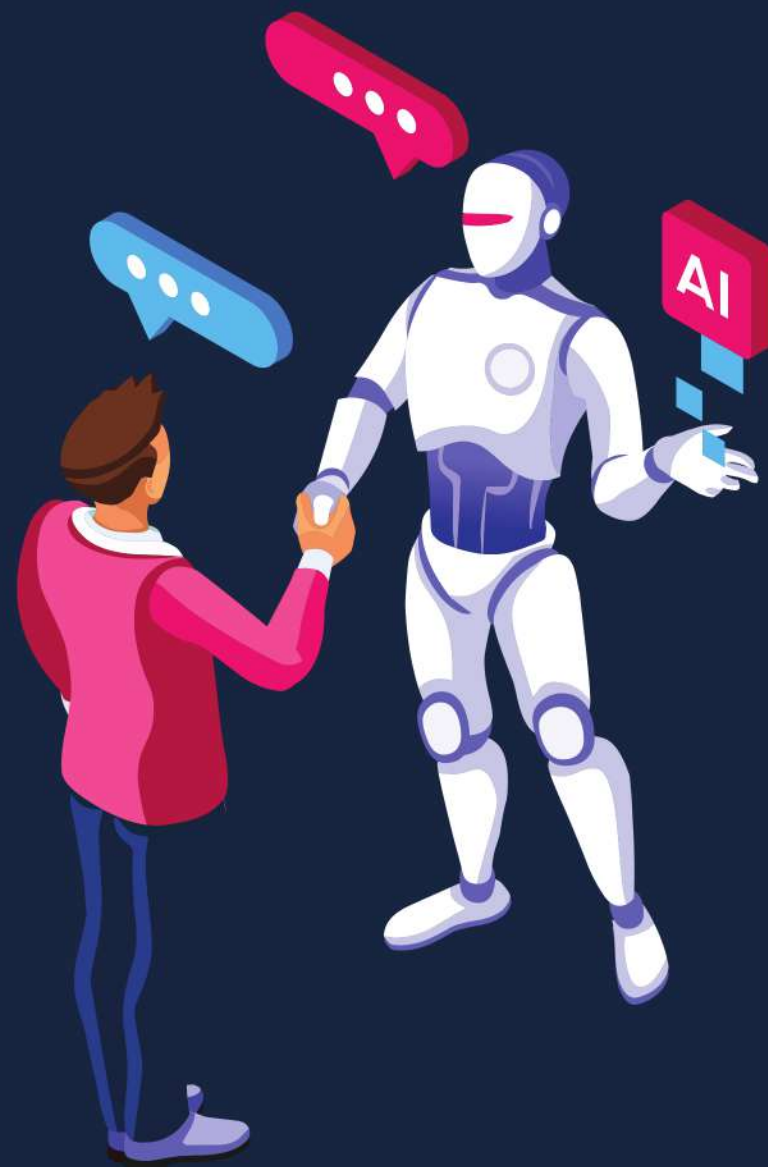
HISTORICAL CONTEXT

Prior to PL 2338/2023, three bills on Artificial Intelligence were being processed:

→ **PL 5051/2019**, which establishes the principles for the use of AI in Brazil;

→ **PL 872/2021**, on the use of AI;

→ **PL 21/2020**, proposing foundations, principles and guidelines for the development and application of AI in Brazil, approved by the Chamber of Deputies.





The new bill of law, therefore, is based on the conclusions of the Commission of Jurists, resulting from a series of public hearings and an international seminar, events of which took part not only government representatives, but also members of the organized civil society, of the private sector and of the academia.

Furthermore, over one hundred written statements from stakeholders also contributed to the Commission's report, alongside a study, by the Legislative Consultancy of the Senate, on the regulation of AI in more than 30 countries of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

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NEXT STEPS

PL 2338/2023 is **awaiting dispatch for publication** and further processing in the Senate. Subsequently, it will be examined by the Chamber of Deputies (reviewing house) and, finally, after the legislative procedures, it will be forwarded to presidential sanction.
